ORGANIZATION BACKGROUND

Integrated Rural Development Organization (IRDO) is a non-governmental organization founded in 1989 legally registered in Tanzania under ACT 2002.Our Headquarters are located at Ileje District in Songwe region and it's physical offices are in Tunduma Town council and Sumbawanga District

Council. Our The organization has more than 30 years of service in Tanzania with 34 staff with diverse professional backgrounds in fields of agriculture, nutrition, health, community development, project management, communication, human resource management, procurement, accounts and finance.

Our main strategic focus is to strengthening development initiatives in Songwe and Mbeya regions. Our Vision is to improve livelihoods and sustainable resource management amongst the Tanzanian society. Our Mission is to empower disadvantaged communities by diversifying their quality of life. Goals of the

organization is to improve food security, improved livelihood of vulnerable groups, increased access to markets, reduced HIV infections together with financial and organizational sustainability.

OVERVIEW OF OUR MAJOR PROJECT HIV CARE AND SUPPORT PROGRAM

IRDO has been in Partnership agreements with HJFMRI to implement Community HIV Prevention. Treatment and Retention interventions in close collaboration with the Tanzanian Ministry of Health (MoH) and the President's Office of the Regional Administration and Local Government (PORALG), through the Regional and Council Health Management Teams in the two councils of Songwe **Region which are Momba District Council** and Tunduma Town Council with the aim of reaching 95-95-95 goal to Ending the HIV/AIDS epidemic by 2030. The Program covers 13 wards of Momba District Council and 16 wards of Tunduma Town Council with their respective health facilities.

IRDO has been implementing this program since 2017.

The HIV Care and Support Program is implemented with a yearly budget value of USD 153,767 for the Financial Year 2022/2023 (FY23) financed by PEPFAR through WRAIR and HJFMRI. Up to date the program has reached more than 30,000 People Living with HIV (PLHIV).

Positive Health Dignity and Prevention (PHDP) services. IRDO uses community based approaches whereby the volunteers provide services to the clients and make

DREAMS PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

In 2023, IRDO got a privilege to implement DREAMS program in Tunduma DREAMS program aims at reducing new HIV infections among Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) 15-24 through impactful and evidence-based approaches. Under these interventions, evidence-based approaches/curriculums such as Stepping stone, SASA! and SINOVUYO are used in bringing about positive behavior change, mobilizing the communities against harmful norms.

The Core packages for DREAMS pro-

gram includes Empower AGYW and reduce risk through youth friendly reproductive health care and social asset building, mobilize community for change with school and community based HIV and violence prevention, also reduce risk for sex partners through PEPFAR programming including HIV testing, treatment and voluntarily medical male circumcision (VMMC) and lastly strengthening families/caregivers of AGYW with social protection and social economic support.

FOSEN I& II PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Food Security and Nutrition Improvement FOSEN 1 project, supported by DKA/WELTHUS Austria, was implemented from 2019 to 2022 and covered 12 villages in lleje District. It is a continuation of a 10-year intervention that has been implemented in Ileje since 2009 under the Sustainable agriculture for Food Security Program. The project aimed at improving the nutritional status and food security of third-category households in Ileje district. We're excited to share that the FOSEN I project has achieved success in improving nutrition for over 650 households in Ileje District. By targeting 600 small farmers

in the third category across 12 villages, the project provided comprehensive training on essential topics such as GAP, poultry keeping, environmental protection, establishment of fruits and vegetable gardens, nutritional counselling, and gender sessions. The project also helped increase household income and improve nutritional practices while promoting gender role changes. To ensure that the acquired knowledge was applied at the household level, beneficiaries were closely tracked.

"FOSEN II Project Continues to Improve Food Security and Nutrition in Ileje District"

The Food Security and Nutrition Improvement (FOSEN II) project is a 3-year initiative aimed at improving the nutritional status and food security of third-category households in the lleje district. It is a continuation of FOSEN I intervention that has been implemented in Ileje since 2019 under the Sustainable agriculture for Food Security program. The project will work with paraprofessionals and select target households based on motivation, interest, and commitment to participate. each village, with a focus on improving gender relations and promoting balanced diets. Though there has been positive change in gender roles, some traditional and cultural norms still negatively affect gender relations. The project will incorporate additional elements suggested in the evaluation report and depend on gathered information and experiences from former projects and recommendations of external evaluations and stakeholders' gathered information during reflection meetings.



USAID's /Lishe Endelevu Activity

"IRDO Successfully Implements USAID's Lishe Endelevu Project, Achieves Significant Nutrition Milestones in Tanzania".

USAID's Lishe Endelevu Activity is a fiveyear, \$24.65M project aimed at improving the nutritional status of pregnant and lactating women, children under five, and adolescent girls in 4 regions of Tanzania. IRDO successfully implemented the project in two districts, Sumbawanga MC and Sumbawanga DC, Targeting total of 19 wards, and 189 street and village in Sumbawanga MC and 27 wards,114 villages in Sumbawanga DC.

In year 4, the project reached a cumulative 93% of under-five children with nutritionspecific interventions, exceeded the target for community-level nutrition interventions for children under two by 155%, and reached 103% of the life-of-project target for adolescents reached with nutritionsensitive interventions. However, there were challenges in reaching targets for improved management practices in agriculture, but the project implemented a new tracking tool to improve performance in this area.

Additionally, the project achieved 76% of the target for female participation in Village Saving and Loan Association (VSLA) groups designed to increase access to economic resources, which is above the

target of 56%. It's important to note that year 5 is a transition period as the project is phased out with no cost.

The project's success is a result of collaborations with local government authorities. civil society organizations, and other implementing partners. The project focused on social and behavior change for optimal infant and young child feeding, promoting nutrition-sensitive livelihoods, and shifting gender norms and equitable household decision-making. The project's package of interventions built around capacity development, social and behaviour change, and a strong enabling environment has ensured sustainable change at all levels, from the national government to individual house-
