NANE NANE DAY





On August 8th every year, Tanzania normally commemorates a national event (Nanenane/Peasant's Day) as a climax but preceded by a week of exhibitions by business stakeholders (private farmers, companies), government respective ministries, entrepreneurs various and stakeholders on agricultural technologies, innovations and products for public learning and trading. "Vijana na Wanawake ni Msingi Imara wa Mifumo Endelevu ya Chakula" was the theme for 2023 Nanenane Exhibitions held at John Mwakangale grounds in Mbeya City insisting on investing in youth and women for sustainable food systems.

IRDO staff and beneficiaries in collaboration with Tumaini Community Services Organization, under HJFMRI support, showcased their activities and displayed products that were crafted by Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) of 15 - 24 years of age through established DREAMS Program workshops. FOSENI Program under Mbozi, Ileje and Isangati Consortium (MIICO) showcased their agricultural products including traditional seeds, technologies in livestock keeping and compost manure preparation; land rights and gender equity. Learning was well grasped through various booths including PO-RALG, BRELA, VETA and SIDO in networking and gaining creativity and innovation skills in developing new advanced technologies.

IRDO in partnership with HJFMRI implements PEPFAR HIV care and treatment interventions (DREAMS and HIV Prevention, Care and Support Programs) at Tunduma Town Council and Momba District Council under the Ministry of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children(MoHCDGEC), and the President's Office - Regional Administration and Local Government(PO-RALG) through the respective Regional and Council Health Management Teams. A planning session was conducted from 9th to 11th August 2023 at Royal Tughimbe Hotel, Mbeya City aiming at orienting partners on FY24 Programmatic, Contract Terms and the changes based on program alignment with the donor changes as stipulated in the PEPFAR's COP 23 and plan for the FY24 interventions in compliance with PEPFAR's COP 23 guidance. The session involved all community and health facility partners (RHMTs and CHMTs) partnering with HJFMRI in the Southern Highland regions including Songwe, Mbeya, Katavi, Ruvuma and Rukwa.



PELUM TANZANIA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



IRDO is one among the historical and active members of PELUM Tanzania. It's key in decision making and implementation of various programs/projects in the country including sustainable agriculture, food security and nutrition and climate change mitigation and control. This year IRDO participated in the 25th annual general meeting on 17th and 18th August in Morogoro and came up with election of members of Board of Directors, active membership with insistence of timely fee payment as organizational running machinery. IRDO is benefiting from the consortium having assurance of grasping grants from the platform and acquiring organizational management capacity building.



New office premises for PELUM Tanzania supported by the Bread for the World was inaugurated with action points on income generating activities within the building and beautification of the area including landscaping, tree planting and gardening.

IRDO IN UHURU TORCH RACE



IRDO participated in Uhuru Torch race in Momba, Tunduma and Ileje Councils where health and economic services were provided including, positive behavioural change and economic strategy awareness to AGYW. HIV/AIDS counselling and testing was conducted reaching 370 clients (140 female and 230 male) whereby 6 of them turned positive (5 female and 1 male). In positive behavioural change, we based in elimination of drug use. Some

success stories were shared from Medically Assisted Therapy (MAT) beneficiaries who previously used to inhale and inject drugs on how worse and dangerous their lives used to be, the health education they gained from IRDO leading to quitting from using drugs. The health education package for dug users include demand creation in self

determination, resilience and self awareness. Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and economic strengthening were a crosscutting matter throughout the activity sessions. Uhuru Torch Race - National Leader 2023, Comrade Abdalla Shaib Kaim attentively listening to details about the preventive education services against drug use provided by Community Outreach Worker, Shaban who is also a beneficiary of the project during stationing of the Uhuru Torch in Tunduma Town.



CAPACITY BUILDING TRAININGS



YOUTH ADVOCACY CHAMPION

Tanzania Commission for AIDS (TACAIDS) in collaboration with UNICEF facilitated a 3 day training for building capacity to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and for equipping young people, LGA officials from the AGYW programs (DREAMS) Southern Highland Councils (Njombe, Iringa, Songwe and Mbeya). The main aim was providing knowledge and skills in engaging young people by working together as partners, addressing issues that impact adolescent girls and young women wellbeing. Also the training identified advocacy challenges affecting young people from respective regional authorities and develop actionable plans for appropriate intervention. Getruda Kasege, Social Welfare Officer - DREAMS attended the trainings.

AFRIYAN TANZANIA

AfriYAN Tanzania Non-Governmental Organization which focuses increasing Meaningful Youth Participation African development including Tanzania by enhancing friendly environment that will enable young people to fully participate in youth and national development agenda through 3 interventions; empowerment, public awareness and youth participation.

On 9th to 12th August 2023 AfriYAN Tanzania hosted a training whose members were NGOs from Dar es Salaam, Dodoma, Mbeya, Sonawe, Shinyanga, Kahama and Zanzibar.The training aimed at improving NGOs capacity on preparation and submission of concept notes and proposals for funding of appropriate youth development interventions and reviewing challenges faced by youth on accessing loans as approach to economic empowerment. IRDO participated in the training, represented by Getruda Sepocho - HIV Prevention Focal Person.



RURAL WOMEN ASSEMBLY

The Rural Women's Assembly (RWA) is a self-organised alliance of national rural women's movements, assemblies, grassroots organisations and chapters of mixed peasant unions, federations and movements across 10 countries in the SADC region.

In September 2023, RWA hosted a Feminist School in Maputo - Mozambique whereby member organizations including IRDO, represented by Fadhila Sendwa (IRDO RWA Representative) participated. Fadhila presented on the theme of land, violence and body autonomy to other RWA country representatives. During discussions and gallery walk, it was clear that women across the region face common challenges on land rights and ownership,gender-based violence, body autonomy and access to social services; all these look similar to RWA members from different parts of Africa.



USAID-LISHE ENDELEVU CLOSE OUT MEETING



Save the Children International handed over the USAID Lishe Endelevu (Sustainable Nutrition) project activities to the Government Authorities. The event was held at Venance Mabeyo Complex in Dodoma. IRDO was awarded a Certificate of Recognition being a successful partner that implemented the project in Sumbawanga Municipal and Sumbawanga District Councils (Rukwa Region) for 5 years. The guest of honor during the handing over event was the Deputy Minister in the President's Office - Regional Administration and Local Government (PO-RALG), Hon. Deogratius Ndejembi who alongside, launched a story book prepared by Save the Children International going by the name "Voice of Beneficiaries" telling the achievements of the project and how to sustain the services to the community. IRDO was represented by Mr Mawazo Mbuba, Finance and Administrative Manager.

This fame was used to introduce the tourism exhibitions in the southern highland aiming at rising local as tourism development response as well as attracting international tourism interest and inviting investors in various sectors of development. Various tourist sites were visited for recreation and learning.

IRDO participated in the event, represented by Gloria Msaki - Communication and Branding Officer. IRDO is well recognized as NGO that has a Communication and Branding Unit and has a role to attracting investors in the thematic areas of our interventions including public health, food and nutrition as well as climate change control. In the exhibition booths of the Songwe Region, health education was provided more on encouraging the youth to voluntarily get tested on HIV for individual health status concern and for the national development interest. In this way, IRDO was informing the mass, government and investors through tourism industry of the activities we are doing and their implication in development Especially in the Southern Highland zone.



IRDO team along with other organizations got a chance to visit tourist attractions found in Iringa region, to watch sports, games and entertainments that were prepared by Iringa Regional Secretariat for the purpose of selling the south tourism corridor. Among them was Mtwa Mkwawa memorial museum in Kalenga which is found in the former Hehe capital where the skull, personal effects and other relics of Chief Mkwawa including war tools and newspaper written by Germans are found.
